## River basin management and fiscal decentralisation: mutually supportive or counterproductive? A case study of Mongolia

In recent years, Mongolia has experienced the simultaneous introduction of River Basin Management and fiscal decentralisation. River basin management calls for managing water resources at the river basin level in order to promote a sustainable resource use. Fiscal decentralisation involves shifting certain responsibilities to lower levels of government. The presentation explores how fiscal decentralization interacts with river basin management in Mongolia.

We find that at the sub-national level, a high number of actors are involved in water governance and that tasks are partly unclear and overlapping. Furthermore, available funds to River Basin Authorities only cover fixed costs. Province Environmental Agencies have higher budgets, but do not necessarily use these funds for water-related projects. In addition, inconsistent legal provisions on water-use fees have led to competition between Environmental Agencies and River Basin Authorities, but also to first collaborative arrangements.
