Khalaа selgee: The Politicization of Administration in Mongolia as an obstacle to sustainability

Since the democratic revolution in Mongolia, political power has been shifting from one party to another without bigger conflicts. However, these shifts had a major side effect on the civil service: After each parliamentary election, thousands of government officers are fired from their positions. This extreme politicization is called a “political illness” in Mongolia and has been exacerbated for the last 30 years. Each successive government wants its own people, even down to school principals and heads of small municipal units. Despite the fact that civil service reforms have been undertaken in order to create a modern and meritocratic civil service in Mongolia, the legal changes and frameworks were not sufficient to cure the “illness”. During the talk, the following questions will be discussed:

- When and why did this “political illness” start?
- In what ways does this harm institutions and the society?
- How is it connected to political financing and corruption?
- What measures have been taken?
- How are the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) affected?
